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BANGERS TO BLUFF



The 'Bangers to Bluff' car rally is an annual charity event organised by the Rotary Club of Half Moon Bay (Inc), where teams travel from Auckland to Bluff, on a carefully crafted route through spectacular Aotearoa New Zealand on 'roads less travelled'.

The rally is a unique and rich experience, setting the scene for lifelong friendships and opportunities for travel, but also supports a number of charities.

Money is raised through car registrations, sponsorship, donations and auctioning the cars at the end of the event in Invercargill. Proceeds are donated to the event's Masthead charity, Multiple Sclerosis New Zealand (MSNZ) as well as other charities supported by the Rotary Club of Half Moon Bay, including MS societies the rally meets on-route.

The challenge is to **drive a car costing less than \$2000 from Auckland to Bluff** and finish at Invercargill. The 2025 event will be the tenth year the Rally has run and the sixth time MSNZ has been a masthead charity. The events have raised in excess of \$420,000 for charity, of that, MSNZ and our regional societies have received over \$240,000.



OUR INVOLVEMENT

MSNZ has been a grateful participant of the rally since 2018, testament to the mutually supportive relationship we have built with the Rotary Club of Half Moon Bay. 2021 was the first year we entered our own banger, driven by volunteer team 'Keep Smyelin'. The awareness, goodwill and advocacy opportunities experienced always exceeds our expectations, encouraging us to join the rally again.

In 2024, **\$71,000 was raised for MSNZ** and <u>regional MS societies.</u> The team drove over 2,600 kms spreading awareness of this nervous system condition.

One of our dedicated team, Graham, has Primary Progressive MS. In the last few years, due to his MS, he has been experiencing decreasing strength and ability to use his entire left side of his body. Despite this he, and his road bike, ride out at dawn, ahead of the cars, to increase awareness of the event, to prove that MS won't stop him, and highlight the importance of using or losing it!

WHO ARE WE?



At MSNZ we aspire to be 'The National Leader for Service Excellence in Multiple Sclerosis'. Over the next 10 years we are paving the way for the delivery of a consistent national service, accessible and valued by all who are touched by MS – from clinicians to people with MS, their carers and whānau.

We support 18 Regional Societies across Aotearoa to deliver support and services for people affected by MS. Each society employs trained community support staff, helping people to live well in their communities.

MSNZ endeavours to lead excellence in MS care, raise awareness and advocate on national issues which impact the quality of life of MS communities. We provide evidence-based information that supports and encourages people to take control of their diagnosis and condition.

WHAT IS MS?

What is Multiple Sclerosis?

Over 5000 New Zealanders are diagnosed with MS, a chronic health condition, and the most disabling non-traumatic condition for young people globally.

In MS, the protective myelin surrounding the nerves becomes damaged, disrupting the signals that are sent from the brain to various parts of the body. Damage **impacts** cognition, vision, speech, swallowing, fatigue, movement, nerve sensations, the bladder and the bowel. Many symptoms are **complex** and unseen making the condition hard for many to understand. The course of a person's condition and symptoms is different for each individual.

HOW WILL YOUR SPONSORSHIP HELP?

Bangers to Bluff is MSNZ's **primary fundraiser**, supporting our mission to improve the lives of those affected by MS. Key achievements funded by past events include:

 Advocating for broader access to disease-modifying therapies for Relapsing Remitting MS. Our efforts earned the 2023 MS Brain Health Award from the UK's Oxford Health Policy Forum.






HOW WILL YOUR SPONSORSHIP HELP?



- Advocating for funding of the first treatment for Primary Progressive MS, offering new hope to many patients. "We now have hope for the first time in many years," say Murray and Gail, who anticipate better quality of life and potential for employment.
- Conducting a critical review on the cost-effectiveness of ocrelizumab for PPMS in NZ to influence Pharmac's funding model.
- Collaborating with the Neurological Alliance to urge the government to address workforce shortages, increase pharmaceutical funding, enhance community care, improve data collection, and support effective MS treatments.
- Working with the Carers Alliance to spearhead a petition calling on greater recognition and protections for family carers mental, physical and financial health and well-being.
- Advocating for access to Shingrix for shingles, especially for those on immunosuppressive therapies.
